Brad Wiegmann has served as the Principal Deputy Assistant Attorney General for National Security since March 2009. Much of his career has been focused on national security and international law issues, including counterterrorism, intelligence activities, counterproliferation, diplomatic law, economic sanctions, and related litigation and legal policy matters. Before joining the government, Mr. Wiegmann worked at Shea & Gardner in Washington, DC, where he focused on civil litigation, and he served as a law clerk for Judge Patrick E. Higginbotham on the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. He is a graduate of Duke University and Harvard Law School.
