## COUNTERS THE THREAT FROM CHINA

- ★ Extends the Pacific Deterrence Initiative (PDI) to enhance the U.S. posture in the Indo-Pacific region.
- ★ Increases funding for innovative new technologies needed to deter the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), including hypersonics, AI, autonomous systems, cyber, mobile micronuclear reactors, and high energy lasers.



## FY27 NDAA

The FY27 NDAA builds and maintains the overmatch we need to deter Chinese aggression.



## REMOVES CHINA FROM OUR DEFENSE SUPPLY CHAINS

- ★ Establishes the Defense Supply Chain Intelligence and Risk Response Program to enhance DoW's ability to illuminate, assess, anticipate, and respond to risks across the defense industrial base supply chain.
- ★ Strengthens the organization, function, and authorities of the Federal Acquisition Security Council (FASC), which makes recommendations to executive agencies to prohibit the procurement and use of products that pose supply-chain threats.
- ★ Designates an individual in the Office of Industrial Base Policy with primary responsibility for assessing and mitigating risks related to adversarial capital in the national technology and industrial base.
- ★ Prohibits DoW from acquiring humanoid robotic systems that were produced or developed by China and other adversaries.
- ★ Supports ongoing efforts to mitigate dependencies on China for critical materials and rare earth magnets.
- ★ Prohibits DoW from acquiring photovoltaic cells, modules, and inverters from China and other adversaries.
- ★ Prohibits connected vehicles manufactured or controlled by China from operating on U.S. military installations.
- ★ Prohibits DoW from contracting with any motor carrier owned or controlled by Chinese entities and establishes a registry of approved motor carriers.
- ★ Requires DoW to remedy delays in the implementation of prior law eliminating the use of Chinese-made printed circuit boards (PCBs).
- ★ Prohibits the acquisition of used sealift vessels constructed in China.

## ENSURES MISSION SUCCESS IN THE INDO-PACIFIC

- ★ Authorizes over \$4.2 billion in essential military construction projects and expands logistics capabilities in the Indo-Pacific to ensure our forces can sustain the fight.
- ★ Requires the establishment of a cutting edge, all-domain, live virtual constructive synthetic training environment for mission rehearsal in the Indo-Pacific.
- ★ Requires alternative construction methods to accelerate construction of critically needed Indo-Pacific infrastructure.
- ★ Establishes a pilot program to deploy micro nuclear reactors to supply energy to isolated U.S. military installations in the Indo-Pacific.
- ★ Establishes a pilot program in the Indo-Pacific to field advanced manufacturing capabilities to support the supply of parts and repair items closer to the warfighter.



## BOLSTERS TAIWAN'S DEFENSE

- ★ Fully funds the Taiwan Security Cooperation Initiative at \$1 billion.
- ★ Authorizes funding for U.S. forces to continue training Taiwan and other partner nations in resisting China's aggression and malign influence.

## SUPPORTS INDO-PACIFIC ALLIES AND PARTNERS

- ★ Reaffirms U.S. support for the defense of South Korea.
- ★ Fully funds U.S. Forces Korea and military construction projects in South Korea.
- ★ Fully funds military exercises with the South Korean Armed Forces.
- ★ Requires the Pentagon to certify that certain conditions are met and to assess impacts on security prior to reducing U.S. force structure in South Korea below 28,500 or executing the transition of wartime operational control from the United States to South Korea.



## COUNTERS CHINA'S MALIGN INFLUENCE

- ★ Prohibits students from China and other adversaries from attending our Military Service Academies.
- ★ Fully funds military information operations assistance to Indo-Pacific allies to counter Chinese influence operations.
- ★ Requires DoW to brief Congress on efforts to partner with foreign militaries in the Western Hemisphere to oppose Chinese influence.
- ★ Requires DoW to report to Congress on Chinese intelligence assets in the country of Georgia.
