Justification:	<p>The project would enhance the readiness of an important reserve airlift wing on the East Coast centrally located in the Mid-Atlantic. Units from Dover Air Force Base have participated in important missions to EUCOM, AFRICOM, and CENTCOM. This project has local support - currently the Central Delaware Chamber of Commerce supports the project.</p> <p>Building 270 at Dover AFB is occupied by the 512 OG Staff, 512 OSS, 709 AS, and 326 AS with a combined manning of over 350 personnel and does not have enough square footage to adequately support all assigned airmen. The building has been modified to create additional needed office and meeting space by repurposing hallways, storage closets, and locker rooms. This has resulted in deficiencies of storage space that were remedied by comingling mobility equipment and supplies with occupied workstations, as well as using space within briefing rooms and restrooms. The greatest impact to the mission is the limited amount of space available for computer workstations, with less than 60% of the total authorization available. Squadrons have added as many as three workstations to single workstation desks in an effort to compensate for the space deficiency. Despite these efforts, the number of available workstations remains inadequate, and the basic duties and training of airmen is negatively impacted by limited computer access during Unit Training Assembly (UTA) weekends. By doubling and tripling the intended capacity of workstation desks, the quality of life for airmen degrades. In total, B270 is deficient 3,451 net square feet (NSF) of facility space. If not provided, the 326 AS and 709 AS will have to continue to find ways to compensate for space deficiencies without this project. Prolonged reliance on compensatory measures to accomplish the mission-related tasks has the potential to negatively affect the mission and morale. The Facility itself has condition issues such as numerous roof leaks where water infiltration has caused interior damage to the building and equipment that are detrimental to health and safety.</p>		
Project Purpose:	Construct a 3,069 square meter (SM) facility for the 512th Airlift Wing (AW) Operations Group (OG) including all required supporting utilities, pavements, site improvements, and communications. Facility 270, the existing 512 OG facility, will be demolished upon construction completion of the new facility. Demolition will include the removal and disposal of all related hazardous materials. Structure will comply with base architectural compatibility standards. The facility will comply with applicable DoD, Air Force, and installation design standards. Additionally, local materials and construction techniques will be used where cost effective. The project will comply with DoD antiterrorism/force protection requirements per Unified Facilities Criteria.

The permanent loss of the Red Hill water supply would also significantly reduce the water resources available to meet the demands at Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam and strain operations at the military's other water supply sources. In addition, the inability to mitigate a known potential contamination event when a proven and effective treatment exists is eroding servicemembers and the public's confidence that the Navy drinking water system is safe.</p> <p>Note - the full cost of the project is \$505 million, but this request is for the incrementally executable amount of \$160 million.</p>

Justification:	Current cooling water flow restrictions will prevent Arnold AFB from being able to execute upcoming concurrent test requirements. With increased test loads coming, the end result will be delays to one or multiple test programs or failure to execute all testing requirements. Failure to execute could have detrimental effects to the following test programs: Hypersonic Standoff Weapons, Turbine Based Combined Cycle, Hypersonic Munitions, Data Masked Programs, Next Generation Bomber, and Future 6th Generation Fighter Aircraft and Future Strike Aircraft.		
Project Purpose:	Cooling water is an installation-wide critical asset/utility as typical day-to-day operations, and all testing requirements depend heavily upon this commodity. With a new hypersonic ground test mission, reactivation of mothballed testing facilities, and an increased workload across the installation there is a need for additional cooling water capacity, flexibility, and availability. In order to meet future testing requirements, Arnold will have to execute concurrent tests, which will drive cooling water requirements beyond current capability. Through evaluating multiple concurrent testing scenarios, it was determined that Arnold would need to be able to deliver up to 600,000 gallons/minute (a few highly unlikely scenarios required even more), the ability to feed separate test cells at differing conditions, and better utilize water collected at the retention reservoir which feeds the Rowland Creek Pumping Station. Though several solutions were evaluated, this solution is the most economic while still meeting all of our requirements. This improvement would increase our cooling water capacity from 460,000 gallons/minute to 620,000 gallons/minute.

Justification:	If this project is not executed, we will continue to see inefficient operations during delivery and setup as well as have other shortfalls within the facility like limited restroom space, office space, and conference room space.		
Project Purpose:	<p>Building 880 supports the J1/J2 test cells used for propulsion engine testing. When test articles are delivered to the test cell, the transport truck is forced to park along a roadway, and a large outdoor fork truck will then carry the test article through a maze of old abandoned test infrastructure to the test building. Once at the test building, the article is placed on a cart, as the fork truck cannot enter the building. The article is pushed on the cart inside where the overhead crane will take control of it, and it will be installed in the test cell. All test article instrumentation/setup is done inside the test cell, meaning this can only be done when another engine is not being tested. The demo of the current abandoned test structure, the addition to the building, and the direct roadway connecting the current infrastructure to the new addition allow the transport vehicle to pull directly into the test bay and unload the article. This also provided the necessary space for the article to be set up and have necessary instrumentation installed prior to testing which means this can be done while another engine is being tested. Facility operations are inefficient during test article delivery and setup.</p>
